The following exemplify the excellence in provision and the relentless commitment of all members of the school community to not only maintain but also to further enhance this outstanding provision.

1. The strength, support and vibrancy offered to the whole faith community by the leadership team:
 - A very effective pupil performance tracking system is used well to ensure children make good and outstanding progress.
 - The Parish Priest, governors and the whole faith community are in full partnership with the school.
 - Leaders ensure children are able to be actively involved in their own faith development, through for example, the "faith council."
2. The consistently high quality of teaching and learning in Religious Education:
 - The majority of teaching of RE observed by the inspector was outstanding or good with outstanding features.
 - The children fully appreciate their Catholic identity, understand the Mission Statement and made it a living reality in their community.
 - There is an excellent range of opportunities offered to the children to develop their spirituality in Collective Acts of Worship.
3. The work of the school in the wider community:
 - Children are active in 'living out their faith' through such projects as "Comenius" and the obvious impact this has, not just within the faith community, but in the wider European dimension.
 - There are strong links within the All Saints' Parish, where all work in unison to live out their shared Catholic identity.

The school remains committed to strengthening its tracking and assessment procedures and to further developing Collective Acts of Worship.
